<u>English</u>

The Man Who Walked Between the Two Towers by Mordicai Gerstein

Literary Theme - Ambition & desire

Main Outcome - Biography/Autobiography

Word Reading - Apply their growing knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes

Writing - Using formal language and figurative language

Reading Comprehension - Inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions and justify inferences with evidence.

Pupils will be identifying different types of figurative language in the text and evaluate how the author has used different styles of language.

Pupils will be practising spelling words with the 'ough' phoneme and learn to recognise and spell the suffixes cian/tion/ssion/sion. Pupils will research themes explored in the book to apply to their own independent writing.

Maths

Place value within 100, 000

This unit provides the foundation for working with numbers up to 100,000 and develops fluency with place value to support calculating during the year.

Place value within 1,000,000

This unit builds on previous experience of comparing, ordering and rounding numbers from the previous unit. This unit provides preparation for using place value grids to add and subtract 5-digit numbers.

Addition & Subtraction

This unit will extend their knowledge of addition and subtraction using formal methods for numbers with up to 5 digits. It will give children the opportunity to build confidence with problem solving and to explore efficient methods for addition and subtraction calculations, including those that can be solved mentally.

<u>Qur'an, Arabic and Islamic Studies</u>

QURAN

Revision of Juz Amma and Tabaarak. Tajweed Rules: To learn and apply the four rules of Nun Saakinah and Tanween: Idhaar, Idghaam, Iqlaab and Ikhfaa.

ARABIC

This half term we will look at word to word definitions of Surah Fatiha to Surah Feel. Students should be able to have an in depth understanding of the overall meaning of each of the Ayahs as well as a brief Tafsir/explanation of each of the Surahs and how they can relate the key points to their own actions and their life.

SLAMIC STUDIES

This term, we will begin with essential revision of the content taught in the previous year. Students will then learn about a range of Allah's names alongside their meaning and how we can begin to love Allah more, Angels, Holy books, signs of the Day of Judgement and the rituals of Hajj.

Homework

Homework will be set every Friday and children are expected to complete the homework by Tuesday. **Qaida and Quran** folders should be brought to school on **Tuesdays** and **Wednesdays**.

Foundation Subjects

SCIENCE: Mixtures and Separation

Pupils explore different types of mixtures and the different methods that can be used to separate them. They dissolve a range of substances, identify different solutions and investigate how temperature affects the time taken to dissolve. They design and create a water filter, sieve soil and evaporate solutions.

GEOGRAPHY: What is life like in the Alps?

Considering the climate of mountain ranges and why people choose to visit the Alps; focusing on Innsbruck and looking at the human and physical features that attract tourists; investigating tourism in the local area and mapping recreational land use; presenting findings to compare the Alps to the children's own locality.

ART: Chinese Art

- To explore the themes, styles and colours of traditional Chinese art.
- To explore the theme of dragons.
- To find out about importance of brushstrokes.
- To find out about and replicate Chinese calligraphy.
- To find out about the Terracotta Army.
- To find out about and recreate porcelain of the Ming dynasty.

<u>PSHE: Understanding Deen in its Eternity and Following Rules & Laws</u>

Understanding Deen in its Entirety

Children will have the opportunity to reflect on their faith, how to build God-consciousness and to learn how to be responsible young Muslims.

Following rules and laws.
