Ustadah Sidra

English

We will be reading the books **The Arrival** by Shaun Tan. We will learn to draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions and justify inferences with evidence. Identify how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning. Participate in discussions about books that are read to them and those they can read for themselves, building on their own and others' ideas and challenging views courteously.

Maths

Unit 1 Place value within 10,000,000. In this unit, children extend their knowledge of numbers from within 1,000,000 to within 10,000,000, before they go on to work with the four operations in the next two units. This includes looking at place value, ordering and comparing numbers and rounding. They will also look at number lines and negative numbers.

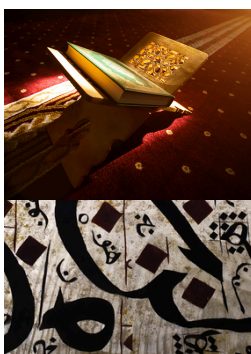
Unit 2 Four operations (1) This unit builds on children's knowledge of using formal columnar written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, including with real-life contexts. Unit 3 In this unit, children use their knowledge of the four operations to consider specific properties of numbers. They learn about the order of operations and mental methods, before moving on to work with fractions in Unit 4.

Qur'an, Arabic and Islamic Studies

Qur'an: Tajweed Rules: Nun Saakinah and Tanween. Focus on the rules of Idhaar, Idghaam and Ikhfaa.

Islamic Studies: In this term, Year 6 will learn more about who Allah is and our purpose on earth, Tawhid and Shirk, the virtues of the Qur'an and how we can embody its teachings and the rituals of Hajj.

Arabic: This half term we will look at word to word definitions of Surah Humazah to Surah Zaalzalah. Students should be able to have an in depth understanding of the overall meaning of each of the Ayahs as well as a brief Tafsir/explanation of each of the Surahs and how they can relate the key points to their own actions and their life.

Classifying Big and Small

Pupils will:

- Broaden their knowledge of how vertebrates, invertebrates, plants and micro-organisms are grouped using shared characteristics.
- Discover how Carl Linnaeus developed the Linnaean and binomial systems for classifying and naming living things.
- Use and produce branching and number classification keys to sort and identify organisms.

Geography

Why does population change?

Pupils should be able to:

- Identify the most densely and sparsely populated areas.
- Describe the increase in global population over time.
- Begin to describe what might influence the environments people live in.
- Define birth and death rates, suggesting what may influence them.
- Define migration, discussing push and pull factors.

Art

Pupils should be able to:

- Understand how graffiti polarises opinion, identify features of graffiti art.
- Study images of stencil street art by Banksy.
