

Story of Noor ul Islam

Noor ul Islam's journey began in 1988 at a community centre, where local members, guided by a mufti's advice, recognised the need for a dedicated place of worship. Within a short period, 711 Leyton High Road became available, and Noor ul Islam Trust was established in 1990.

From the start, our vision extended beyond a masjid to creating a vibrant community hub. Recognising the need for quality education, we expanded to include a pre-school and later a primary school.


In January 2001, an old health clinic on Dawlish Road was acquired. By September 2001, Noor ul Islam Primary School opened with 96 pupils in Reception, Year 1, and Year 2, expanding year by year to cover Reception through Year 6.

To support this growth, a mezzanine floor was added in 2002, and a neighbouring building was transformed into an annex, allowing the school to flourish into a complete one-form-entry school.

Parents are the backbone of our school, and their unwavering support has been instrumental in our success. As we continue this journey, we remain committed to serving and enriching the Muslim community in Leyton, London, and beyond. Our progress mirrors Noor ul Islam Trust's wider mission, including the ambitious 'Project Rebuild' of our masjid.












A Well-Rounded Education





Noor ul Islam Primary School follows the National Curriculum for England while incorporating a well-rounded education. The school nurtures pupils' academic, physical, spiritual, and moral development, equipping them with problem-solving, critical thinking, and ways to support their wellbeing.

curriculum blends national standards with a tailored Islamic programme, **Studies** delivered through modern teaching methods. Pupils receive dedicated lessons in both general and Islamic education, including Islamic Sciences, Qur'anic (Qa'ida studies & Tajwid), Arabic. Islamic and general subjects throughout integrated are the school day.

Through enriched educational experiences, pupils learn to stay safe, maintain good health, build positive relationships, and actively contribute to British society while upholding fundamental British values.

The school offers an exceptional range of extra-curricular clubs and opportunities. Weekly clubs include public speaking, kickboxing, engineering and calligraphy. Pupils learn about a range of cultures and faiths different to their own, encouraging a culture of respect. They learn about fundamental British values, such as democracy. Educational visits, including to the Houses of Parliament, help to bring their learning to life.


