English

Book: Until I Met Dudley by Roger McGough and Chris Riddell

- Possessive apostrophe -'s used accurately in words.
- Use of regular and irregular plurals.
- Retrieve and record information from non-fiction.
- Summarising ideas.
- Main outcome: Two explanation texts.

Book: The Iron Man by Ted Hughes and Laura Carlin

- Writing stories full of action & suspense.

Adding clarity and detail to sentences by adding fronted adverbials.

- Proofreading for spelling and punctuation mistakes.
- Using inverted commas to punctuate direct speech.

Maths

Number - Addition and Subtraction

- This unit builds on previous learning in Year 3 on adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers.
- Children develop their skills on estimation, answer-checking strategies and problem-solving skills.

Measurement - Perimeter

- This unit builds on the concept of 2D shapes.
- They will learn about the properties of squares and rectangles.

Number - Multiplication and Division

- Children will learn how to multiply by equal grouping and to divide using sharing.
- Develop their reasoning skills.
- Learn their times tables/division facts of 0, 1, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 100.

Foundation Subjects

Science - Electricity and circuits

Children will explore appliances that use electricity in their setting. They will learn how to work with electricity safely and build circuits. Pupils will investigate electrical conductors and insulators and explore the relationship between the number of cells and bulb brightness. They will explore real scenarios and historical discoveries.

History - How have children's lives changed?

- Investigating the changes in children's lives through time, children learn how children's spare time, health and work have changed. They explore work in more detail, learning about a day in the life of a working child and the significance of Lord Shaftesbury in changing the lives of children.

Design & Technology - Pencil Cases

Children will:

- Investigate a range of pencil cases.
- Practise and compare sewing stitches.
- Investigate ways of opening and closing pencil cases.
- Sew embellishments to a piece of fabric.
- Design a pencil case.
- Make and evaluate a pencil case based on a design.

Religious Education-Buddhism

Who is a Buddhist and what do they believe?

- Learn about Buddhism as a religious tradition that was originally passed on by word of mouth.
- Explore the Buddhist festival called Wesak.
- Understand why Buddhists meditate and how they meditate.

Computing- The Internet

In this unit, children learn about preventing and dealing with cyberbullying; how to use search engines efficiently; how to avoid plagiarism online; and how to be a good digital citizen.
