English

The Lost Thing by Shaun Tan

Pupils will be identifying different types of figurative language in the text and evaluate how the author has used different styles of language.

Pupils will be practising spelling words with the 'ough' phoneme and learn to recognise and spell the suffixes cian/tion/ssion/sion. Pupils will research themes explored in the book to apply to their own independent writing.



Unspoken by Henry Cole

Pupils use their inference skills to explore what is happening in this wordless book. They examine the historical period of the time and write as the main character, ensuring they can draw upon any experiences they have had themselves where a dilemma is presented. They finish the sequence by researching the life of Harriet Tubman and writing a biography.



Maths

Multiplication and division (2), Fractions (1), Fractions (2)

Children will be learning how these units interlink. Pupils will be:

- Simplifying fractions
- Making equivalent fractions
- Converting between improper and proper fractions
- Adding/Subtracting fractions by finding a common denominator
- Multi-step problems involving fractions

Measure – area and perimeter

To provide students with the ability to measure shapes– understand that perimeter and area have a relationship. Children will also have the opportunity to use these skills for the real world, calculating the perimeter and area helps determine whether a place has enough space.

Decimals and Percentages

This unit will allow children to apply their knowledge of place value and number operations to solve simple problems based on the data presented in tables and line graphs. Children will look at examples of line graphs that display discrete and continuous data and at dual line graphs.

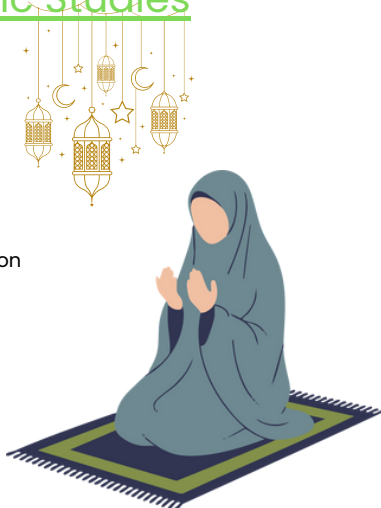
