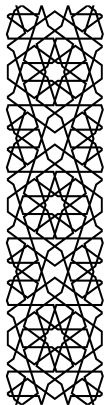


Maths

Unit 14: Problem solving.

Children apply their knowledge and skills in problems with and without context, some of which may appear less familiar because the problem is non-routine. They represent problems using bar models to help make sense of a problem and the relationships within it, exposing the operations needed.

Qur'an, Arabic and Islamic Studies



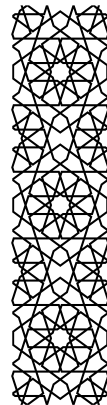
Qur'an: The Hifdh goal this half term is the completion of Surah Mulk and revision of Juz 29 (Tabaarak)
